







Below is a personalized status update for the City of Palmdale. Since the enrollment of the City in September 2013, SoCalREN Public Agency Programs have worked with the City to improve its energy efficiency and save money. To date, this collaboration has saved 38% of overall electric energy usage and 0% of overall gas energy usage<sup>1</sup>.
